

Our president, Kay Denison, called the meeting to order. We recited the Pledge of Allegiance. No visitors today. Sue Ellen moved to approve the November minutes and Michelle seconded. Motion approved.

**Treasurer's Report**: Nancy Church presented the report for November:

#### **Old Business:**

Quilt Show: There is an opening for the chair persons of the demo committee. There will be a meeting after our January guild meeting for all the chair persons. Check the sign up sheets for other committees that still need help. Trish needs to order ribbons and will order the same as she did last year. It was suggested that we add an "other quilted items" category to acknowledge items entered in the show that are not quilts. Nancy suggested that we put advertisements for the show in the North Fork Chamber of Commerce newsletter. Please continue sewing items for sale in the boutique. Attach the price and your initials to each item.

Today is the Christmas party.

Programs and classes: Volunteers are still needed. It was suggested that we break this committee into 2 categories with 2 people doing the job. We could create special interest groups. Nancy will publish the list we have of what members have already requested for classes. If you would like a specific class, help to organize it. We have guild members who can teach us. Send your suggestions to Nancy or Dee.

Storage unit: We pay for a storage unit to house guild items. The question is: do we keep paying for this or find another option that is less costly? After a brief discussion, Connie moved that we keep the storage unit for now and Sue Ellen seconded. Motion passed. We will come back to this issue as we explore alternatives.

New Business: Pam presented the Volunteer of the Year award to Diane Walker.

Nancy Z. presented the WIPs awards: first place to Jan Leser with 5 quilts; and a tie for second place to Trish Tuin and Nancy Church with 3 quilts each.

The newsletter will be printing our birthday months with no day from here forward for privacy reasons.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Refreshments:** Deb Ferrier is heading up this committee but needs help. Please sign up for a month to be in charge of the refreshments.

**Sunshine Lady:** Sallie sent cards to Connie Hutto, Shirley Bell, Trish & Van Tuin, Karla Nolte and Barb Roberts. **Raffle:** Kitty reported 1,000 tickets were purchased, 652 sold @ \$5 each for a total of \$3,260. We sold more tickets this year than last (\$2747) and saved more (\$293.47) in printing costs. We netted \$806.47 over last year. Looks like our experiment of selling fewer tickets at \$5 each instead of \$1 was a success! Also, we earned \$385 at the Holiday Fair. **Programs:** January 9 class with Sue Bear from LadyBugz. She will present 3 methods of making log cabin blocks. Febru-

ary 13 Carolyn Ray from Montrose will teach the "Delectable Mountain" quilt pattern. Please sign up for these classes. At our meeting on January 10 we will have a member sale. Bring your fabric, tools, etc. to sell.

**Challenge:** Trish thanked those who participated in the challenge. For those who did not finish, please do so that we can display them all in the quilt show. Deb Ferrier will be leading the BOM challenge for 2026.

**Raffle Drawing:** At 10:00 am we had the 2025 raffle ticket drawing. The winner of the quilt is Margaret Hollembeak. Congratulation, Margie!

Nancy made a special presentation to Kay, our outgoing president: several quilt bags made by Nancy, Sallie and Kitty, 2 snappy bags, a gift card and a few gifts from members. Kay has asked that we continue to make items for the quilt show boutique. Thank you, Kay, for a job well done.

Approval of new officers: Sallie moved and Sue Ellen seconded to approve the new list of officers. Motion approved.


