2026 MYSTERY QUILT

Deb Ferrier is the chairperson for the 2026 Mystery Quilt. You can make a lap/twin (60x84), queen (84x108), or king size (108x108). It's important to have dark, medium, and light color fabrics, of small to medium prints (no large prints). If you use five or more fabrics of each color, they can be scrambled to get a scrappy effect.

The cost is \$20 for the year, which includes the 1-1/2" triangle papers that Deb suggests be used since there are quite a few half square triangles in this quilt. Please let Deb know which size quilt you are making so she can get the required number of triangle papers to you.

The first month's block instructions will be available at the February guild meeting. At the January meeting Deb handed out cutting instructions, so contact Deb if you did not receive these instructions.
