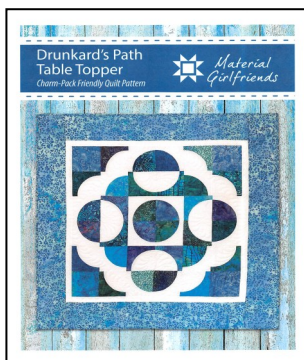

With 8:30 am setup

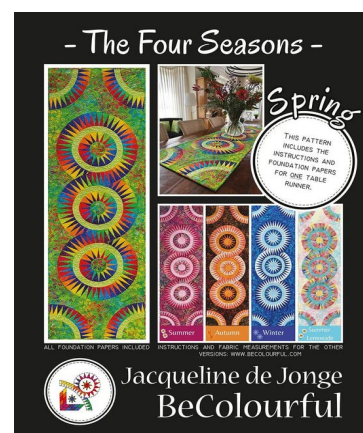
